TRI-MUNICIPAL FOOD DRIVE CHALLENGE WINNERS

A victory in the 2024 Tri-Municipal Food Drive Challenge has been achieved by the Township of Edwardsburgh Cardinal. This annual event, involving Edwardsburgh Cardinal, Augusta, and Prescott in a friendly competition, is organized to support the South Grenville Food Bank, ensuring critical resources are provided to those in need within the community.

An incredible 1,971 pounds of food was collected by TWPEC this year, representing a 40% increase over the previous year's winning total of 1,395 pounds, achieved by Augusta. This milestone is viewed as a reflection of the community's generosity and spirit.

On Saturday, December 21, the coveted trophy was proudly accepted by members of TWPEC council and CAO from Bonnie Cougler, the food banks' Executive Director, during the organization's open house event. BLUE BOX RECYCLING PROGRAM

CHANGES TO THE BLUE BOX RECYCLING PROGRAM

Starting February 1, 2025, the Township of Edwardsburgh Cardinal's Blue Box recycling program will be fully managed by Circular Materials, a not-for-profit organization overseeing Ontario's recycling system. This transition is part of a province-wide move to a producer-funded model under Ontario's Blue Box Regulation.

For residents, there will be no changes to recyclable materials or collection schedules in 2025; continue placing recyclables curbside by 7 a.m. on your regular collection day. In 2026, the program will expand to accept more materials. Starting February 1, recycling inquiries should be directed to Emterra at customercareont@emterra.ca or 1-888-597-1541.
